Question 3

Read the passage and answer the following questions. (45 points)

As technology advances, psychologists can find new opportunities to innovate in the field of psychology and in education. But the introduction of new technologies, such as artificial intelligence (AI) can feel frightening. For psychology instructors in particular, the invention of a rapidly evolving AI software called ChatGPT has introduced new challenges.

ChatGPT, a chatbot* software launched by the AI company OpenAI in November 2022, synthesizes** online data and communicates it in a conversational way. Unlike a search engine, ChatGPT can write poems in the style of Shakespeare, give dating advice, and—especially concerning to educators—answer test questions and write essays.

A *New York Times* article from earlier this year highlights instances of cheating with ChatGPT in college courses and instructors redesigning curriculums to prevent (1) <u>academic dishonesty</u>. Some schools are blocking the technology altogether: Earlier this year, the New York City Department of Education banned the use of ChatGPT based on concerns that it could hinder student learning.

Some educators, however, see ChatGPT as (2) rather than a threat. Psychologist Angela Duckworth argues that it and similar technologies are here to stay—and that instructors should learn how to put it into their curriculum. Many psychology instructors are already experimenting with the software, recognizing that ChatGPT could be a useful tool to prepare students for the real world where critical thinking is more important than mere memorization.

"We have a choice here to (3) <u>lean in</u> or run away, like we had a choice about whether we wanted to use calculators in statistics class," said Kathy Hirsh-Pasek, a professor of psychology at Temple University in Philadelphia.
